Open Spaces Improvement

The Parish Council is seeking to improve its maintenance of parish council owned land in 2016/17.

Primrose Bank Play Area

It is proposed to remove the tired wooden play equipment at Primrose Bank Play Area and replace it with two new pieces of equipment with one additional piece of equipment each subsequent year until the area is complete.

It is also proposed to improve signage and carry out tree/hedge works.

(Please note that contrary to a recent newspaper article, the play area *is* safe to use. The council are choosing to remove the equipment, which is nearing the end of its life, before it becomes unsafe.)

Marston Road

Sufficient funding has been secured to carry out a crime reduction project at Marston Road field which focuses on improving visibility from the road and overlooking properties. This will involve reducing the height of the hedges, felling a couple of trees, re-ordering the entrance, flattening the earth mounds and installing cameras.

Thanks go to Matthew Ellis, Police & Crime Commissioner, Staffordshire County Councillor Mark Sutton, Lapley, Stretton & Wheaton Aston Parish Council, Wheaton Aston Play Strategy Working Group and South Staffordshire District Councillors Roy Wright & Brian Cox for their funding of this project.

The council is also working on a habitat management plan to ensure that the area encourages as much wildlife as possible.

Broadholes Lane

It is hoped that the orchard, grassed and wetland areas will be weeded and better managed in 2016/17, as well as the trees and paths. The willow dome will be attended to and wildlife encouraged to visit the area.

Lapley Green

The Parish Council is proposing to carry out much needed repair work to the wall, fence and decorative posts & chains. Trees will be assessed and pruned/removed/replaced as necessary. A new noticeboard is planned and it is hoped that a defibrillator can be housed in the telephone kiosk.

News From The Church

Thank you to all of you who came and supported our Autumn Fair on September 12th. This was a new venture for us this year, as we did not have a Church Fete earlier in the summer, and it was a great success. We held it at St. Mary's Church, not relying on the weather to be good enough to use the school grounds, but it stayed dry and a few people opted to sit outside in the churchyard for refreshments. Sandwich lunches were popular, as well as all the usual stalls, plus a new one selling homemade jams, preserves and chutneys.

A couple of weeks later we celebrated Harvest in both churches, always an important festival in our rural community. Some of you came to the First School Service, which was held in St. Mary's, the children sang really well and brought their harvest gifts up to join those of the rest of the congregation. There were so many gifts of food to go to the Food Bank in Wolverhampton that the bottom fell out of one of the large plastic containers that we use to transport our regular donations. Thanks to all of you who gave so generously.

On the subject of generosity, many thanks to those of you who have contributed clothes and other items to the appeal for the refugees from Syria. The campaign to collect clothing, tents, sleeping bags, pots and pans, toiletries and more has been running in church throughout October, and will continue until the end of the month. If you would like to know more, there are leaflets available in church, or contact Rev Rachel (details below) The chancel of St. Mary's is piled high with cardboard boxes which will be passed on to the nearest verified collection point/organisation. Monetary donations are also welcome and will be passed to UNICEF to be used to keep children safe.

Anne and Dave Wright are once again co-ordinating the collection of Christmas Shoeboxes that go to needy families in Eastern Europe. Leaflets are available in church or at the Paper Shop in Wheaton Aston, that explain suggested items to go in the boxes, whether it is destined for a family or an elderly person. If you would like to fill a box, they need to be at church early in November, or, if you cannot manage to fill a box, small items or cash donations can be given to Anne and Dave (840656) which will be put together to fill extra boxes.

STOP PRESS! an exciting new venture is happening at St. Mary's church. Every Wednesday evening from 7-9pm during the winter months, except during holiday times, there will be a Youth Drop In for young people aged 11-16 years old. There will be tea and coffee available, board games, craft activities and computer area, as well as a warm place to sit and chat with friends.

Is Your Car Winter Ready?

The weather is getting wetter have you checked your tyres?

Tyres MUST be correctly inflated to the vehicle manufacturer's specification for the load being carried. Always refer to the vehicle's handbook or data. Tyres should also be free from certain cuts and other defects.

Cars, light vans and light trailers MUST have a tread depth of at least 1.6 mm across the central three-quarters of the breadth of the tread and around the entire circumference. Mopeds should have visible tread.
