## Improved Office Facilities

The Parish Council is moving its office from St Mary's First School to the Business Hub based at South Staffordshire Council in Codsall. The move involves the Parish Council's administration function only and contact with the Parish Council Manager will be unchanged. Official travel to and from Codsall by councillors will be limited to essential meetings only. Monthly Parish Council and other meetings will continue to be held within the parish as normal.

Using this new location will substantially reduce our annual office rental costs, significantly improve efficiency and offer enhanced access by the Parish Council Manager to District Council staff, police, voluntary groups and other organisations. Importantly, it will also help the Parish Council to meet its legal responsibilities as an employer of a lone worker.

The success of the move will be monitored by the council during the coming year as a part of its consideration of where, in the long term, its office space should be best located.

We do not anticipate that residents will notice any practical change as a result of this re-location.

## A Busy Year Ahead

In preparation for a busy year, the Parish Council has set its budget for 2016/17. Councillors have carefully reviewed all areas of expenditure taking into account:

- An expanding administrative workload
- New legislation and statutory responsibilities
- Essential maintenance work
- Modest improvements around the parish
- Safe play facilities
- Traditional display of Christmas lights
- Support for local organisations
- Areas where we can save money

Over the past decade the parish council has taken on 3 play areas, a skate park and bus shelter. Some are now in need of significant repair, all require maintenance, insurance, repair, inspection and management. The parish council also owns several pieces of land and over 100 trees which are in need of essential work. In order to properly maintain its own land and facilities, the council has decided to greatly reduce the amount it spends maintaining the parish's churchyards. Small donations will be made in 2016/17 with a view to withdrawing funding completely in 2017/18. Grass cutting of the new cemetery in Lapley will continue.

The parish council is looking to make some modest improvements to enhance life in the parish. Lapley Green will be neatened up, the noticeboard replaced and the telephone box will be repainted and fitted with a defibrillator.

In Wheaton Aston, the parish council has agreed to adopt the new war memorial, replace some play equipment at Primrose Bank Play Area, install planters at the 3 entrances to Wheaton Aston and install a replacement bus shelter on High Street..

The parish council knows how important our local organisations are to everyone living in the parish and has decided to contribute to Wheaton Aston Community First Responders' much needed new vehicle, as well as the carnival committee and the Voluntary Car Service which many residents rely on to get to doctor and hospital appointments.


The traditional Christmas lights and the switch on will continue. Savings have been made wherever possible with care taken to ensure that no noticeable change will be seen by residents or visitors. Expenditure on Christmas lights would be much higher if it weren't for the grants received by county and district councillors and the voluntary contributions by staff, councillors and local companies.

Administration and staffing always forms the major component of our annual budget. Compliance with new legislative changes inevitably involves increased work and we have now reached a point where this can no longer be absorbed as part of the Parish council manager's contracted hours. The parish council has decided to provide some part-time administrative support.

Some of the council's IT equipment has reached the end of its useful life and is in need of replacement. Additional IT facilities are also needed to support an additional employee. The new IT system will be more secure and support the parish council to comply with the Data Protection Act.

These new administrative and staffing costs will be offset to some degree by the financial savings we are making through the relocation of the administrative office to improved facilities at the South Staffordshire Business Hub. In 2016/17 Administration will form 59% of our budget compared with 55% for 2015/16.

How does this affect the 2016 budget? Despite making some important savings we have been obliged to increase our budget in order to maintain our present level of service whilst adding some modest improvements for the benefit of our three villages.



What does this actually mean in financial terms? The parish council tax element for a Band D household will be £114.36 for the year, which is an additional £2.45 per month or 57p per week.

For £2.20 per week (Band D household) in 2016/17 your parish council will provide the following:

Could you join Wheaton Aston Community First Responders as a volunteer responder, or help them in other ways? They're a small team and are always looking for new members, both as active responders and as supporters to help with things like publicity and fundraising.

Training as a volunteer responder works in progressive stages, and is run by West Midlands Ambulance Service NHS FT. Initial training is held over a series of weekends and teaches volunteers to understand and deal with life-threatening emergencies, including controlling severe bleeding and using oxygen therapy and automated external defibrillators.
