## Spring is here at last!

This winter has been a particularly bad one in terms of snow and cold. This month we had to cancel the March Parish Meeting due to the weather. The Agenda items will be carried forward to the April Meeting.

Staffordshire County Council has used a record amount of grit trying to keep our roads clear this winter; Their primary gritting network covers A and B roads only. Other roads are only gritted in severe weather. If this year, your road or pavements were particularly bad, you can prepare for next year by requesting a new grit bin to be installed. You can do this by filling out the online form at <a href="www.staffordshire.gov.uk/transport/staffshighways/Roads-and-highways.aspx">www.staffordshire.gov.uk/transport/staffshighways/Roads-and-highways.aspx</a>. Select 'Report a new fault', 'Weather related' and 'New grit bin'. Locations which qualify for grit bins are risk assessed against a set of criteria that includes but is not limited to:-Steep gradients, Severe bends and Junctions onto major routes.

**Ice Busters -** is an initiative to support self-help groups by providing them with grit and advice to treat footways and paths. To volunteer as an Ice Buster, please contact the highways team. They will help you to develop an action plan

**Clearing your path or driveway -** The Government advise:- Don't be put off clearing paths because you're afraid someone will get injured. Remember, people walking on snow and ice have a responsibility to be careful themselves. And don't believe the myths - it's unlikely you'll be sued or held legally responsible for any injuries if you have cleared the path carefully:

- Try and move the snow and ice as early in the day as possible as it is easier to clear away fresh snow than that which has packed together and hardened through people walking on it. Also, by moving the snow away early it will enable the person to put salt or grit down on the path to stop it freezing again overnight.
- Grit salt or sand should be used rather than water as that can refreeze and turn into black ice, therefore making the
  area more hazardous that it was before the snow and ice was cleared.
- People moving the snow around should take care where they are moving it to as it should not block other people's
  paths or drains. They should also try and clear from the middle of the area first and then move snow from the
  middle out to the sides.
- If possible try and clear neighbours' paths, especially if they are elderly or disabled.

#### Stop The Gailey Freight Hub – Update from the Committee

We have become aware that residents living on the perimeter (i.e. Calf Heath) have received updates on the Community Park and so have the properties near to where the electric cables are to be buried in Gailey.

We are also aware that some residents that have shown an interest in selling their properties to Four Ashes Ltd have received letters sent by registered post asking them to sign to give permission for FAL to have the option on their properties should planning permission be granted. FAL state that they will pay the asking price and some of the legal fees but have not specified how much. Residents now are reluctant to sign up to this.

The planning application will be submitted to planning inspectorate in February/early March. This has been pushed back from original planned timing. The committee are trying to get as many MP's and as many of the 27 parish councils on board as possible, and continue to raise funds to utilise in the best way possible and are taking advice from professionals on these matters.

South Staffordshire Council are opposing this development.

The group continue to work on the different aspects of the application

such as roads, environment, health etc and it will be the next consultation paper that will be key for us. Again we are taking professional advice as to how to tackle the key points.

We are visiting and communicating with other groups that have been involved/ opposed to these kind of developments. Our key points to tackle are: Greenbelt, wrong location, rail line capacity and roads and motorway capacity.

## VACANCY FOR A COUNCILLOR PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN

that a casual vacancy has occurred in the office of Councillor for the ward of Wheaton Aston, Parish of Lapley, Stretton and Wheaton Aston Parish Council following the resignation on 15<sup>th</sup> March 2018 of Councillor Huw Jones

Rule 5(2) of The Local Elections (Parishes and Communities) (England and Wales) Rules, 2006 now applies.

The rule allows **TEN ELECTORS** for the parish [ward] in which the casual vacancy has arisen to request the Returning Officer to hold an election to fill the vacancy.\* That request must be made within **FOURTEEN DAYS**, calculated in accordance with the rules,\*\* of the date of this notice. The fourteen-day period ends on <u>11th April 2018</u>.

#### What if a request to hold an election is not received during the permitted time?

Rule 5(5) of the above Rules will apply. The Parish Council must, as soon as practicable after the expiry of the fourteen-day period, co-opt a person to fill the vacancy.

- There is no form of words for this request, which might simply be a letter headed with such words as "We the undersigned being electors for the [Ward of] ... Parish, call for an election to fill the vacancy arising from the [death] [resignation] of ...". A template entitled "Request for an Election" is available from the Parish Clerk. It is helpful if the ten signatures are accompanied by printed names and addresses.
- In calculating the notice period, day one is the day following the date of this notice; a Saturday, Sunday, Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, Good Friday or a Bank Holiday or day appointed for public thanksgiving or mourning shall be <u>disregarded</u>, and the period closes at midnight on the fourteenth day after the date of this notice. Rule 5(2) of The Local Elections (Parishes and Communities) (England and Wales) Rules, 2006 now applies.
