**CCTV** - Planning permission has been submitted for the Parish Council to install CCTV on Marston Field. CCTV is being installed due to increasing levels of anti-social behaviour. Other options have been considered and various interventions implemented with, sadly, little success. SGS Security will be assisting the Parish Council with this project and will be monitoring the CCTV system 24 hours a day. This decision has not been taken lightly and is a result of multi-agency working.

**Christmas is coming -** This year's Christmas lights switch on is set for Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> November. If your community group or business would like an outdoor stall, if you would like to volunteer as a steward or even perform on stage, please contact the Parish Council Manager.

**Beware - Bogus Officials -** Bogus officials trick their way into people's homes to steal money and valuables. They often work in pairs, one to keep you talking at the front door while the other tries to access your house from a back door or window. Some might even ask for help, such as asking for a glass of water. Older and more vulnerable people are more likely to be a target. While the loss of money or valuables is very distressing, being a victim of crime causes a great deal of stress and may lead to loss of confidence and poor health. If you suspect a caller is bogus, please can the police.
