**Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs)** - Early basic life support and defibrillation give the best chances of survival when someone suffers a cardiac arrest. An AED can be accessed 24/7 by anyone in the vicinity who requires it and ultimately means more lives could be saved.

Thanks to the kind generosity of the Community First Responders and well-supported fundraising events by the community, the Parish Council is very pleased to announce that we are in the process of installing five new defibrillators in the Parish. One in Lapley kiosk on Lapley Geen, one in Stretton at Stretton Lodge, one at the Bradford Arms, one

at the Sports and Social Club and one at Sunnybank Caravan Park. The Community First Responders are installing an additional defib at The Hartley Arms. Early 2020 we hope to install a further defib near to St Mary's First School. Many thanks to those who have housed a defib and cabinet

It is amazing to have life-saving equipment to hand but could you confidently use it? Whilst the defibrillator unit 'talks' you through how to use it, wouldn't it be advantageous to be fully trained by professionals? The Community First Responders have offered to organise training sessions free of charge. Please email the office (office@wheatonastonprishcouncil.gov.uk) and let us know if you would like to attend.

Every second counts, a morning of your time to train could save someone's life.

**SID is coming!** - SID (speed indicator device) will be coming very soon to Ivetsey Road. The Speed watch group have fed back information to the PC on speeding hot spots and this area needs addressing with urgency. **Please consider your speed!!** There is a speed limit for a reason!!

**Lapley Green -** The Lapley Green renovation project continues. The PC has decided to add some more post and chain link fencing to the area and to paint this in keeping with the fingerposts. A pathed area will be installed outside the notice board, a beautiful commemoration bench has recently been installed, the holly hedge will be continued along one side of the green, and the phone box will be revamped with red and gold paint. Although this will need to wait until the Spring. No more trees will be planted at this time, this will be reconsidered in October 2020.

**Marston Field -** The CCTV is up and fully functional!! This is monitored and the PC will further any issues that occur in the area. 2019 has seen the remaining wooden fencing broken on numerous occasions, this will be replaced with metal estate fencing very soon

**Damage to the Highway –** Highways are the responsibility of Staffordshire County Council Highways Department. The quickest way to report potholes/damaged pavements / problems with lighting columns and road signs is to do it on the Staffordshire County Council website, or download the "My Staffs'" app, which let you send in photos and locations straight from your phone.

#### **Climate Change**

Climate Change has become a matter for all individuals to consider. Very recently most parishes in the district have struggled with flooding. Something as seemingly insignificant as how you pave your drive can hugely impact on flooding.

In 2008 there was a change in legislation which governs the rights of residents to pave their front garden with hard standings without planning permission. If the surface to be covered is more than five square meters planning permission is required for laying traditional, impermeable driveways, i.e. nonporous concrete or asphalt, unless the rainwater is directed to a soakaway or border rain garden to drain naturally within the boundary of the property.

Driveways completed without the requisite planning permission could be subject to an investigation by planning enforcement. Residents should be wary of companies which provide these types of driveways who claim that the rules can be circumvented.

As the Parish continues to experience issues with flooding we are encouraging residents to consider using permeable (or porous) surfacing such as gravel, permeable concrete block paving or porous asphalt for which no planning permission is required.
