Codsall Offices – small grass enclosure to the side of the main public entrance. **Sytch Lane Cemetery**, Wombourne.

Strawberry Lane Cemetery, Great Wyrley.

These are open from 0800hrs until 1600hrs daily.

If residents cannot lay tributes at the above locations, they are welcome to lay tributes at the **Memorial Stone in Wheaton Aston**. The area is for flower tributes only. Candles must not be laid and will be removed immediately due to potential hazards, faux candles are permitted. Please remove any cellophane/plastic from any flowers left
