Re: M54 combined maintenance work scheme

I'm writing to inform you of some upcoming maintenance work along the M54.

What we're doing and why? What are the benefits?

We'll be carrying out safety barrier upgrades on the westbound exit slip road and eastbound entry slip road of the M54 junction 2. Our work has been identified as the barriers here have reached the end of their serviceable life and now need to be replaced.

We'll also be carrying out drainage work on the M54 between the M6 junction 10a/M54 link road and M54 junction 2. The completed work will ensure the drainage system is working as efficiently as possible to reduce the chance of localised flooding and standing water on the carriageway.

When will this work take place?

Our work will start on **4 September 2023**, and we expect to complete by **3 November 2023**. To carry out our work safely, we'll work under the following phased closures:

4 September to 11 September – full closures of the M54 westbound from M6 junction 10a/M54 link road to M54 junction 1, and full closures of the M54 eastbound from junction 2 to 1, between 9pm and 6am, Monday to Friday.

11 September to 17 October – full overnight closures of the M54 junction 2 eastbound entry slip road, between 9pm and 6am, Monday to Friday. For added safety, we'll also install a temporary safety barrier which will close the hard shoulder 24/7 whilst we work at this location.

17 September to 3 November – full overnight closures of the M54 junction 2 westbound exit slip road, between 9pm and 6am, Monday to Friday. Outside of full closures, the hard shoulder and lane 1 of the exit slip will remain closed until we complete all work at this location. For added safety, we'll also install a temporary safety barrier which will close the hard shoulder 24/7 whilst we work at this location.

What does this mean for you?

During closures, there will be access for emergency vehicles and there will be fully signed diversions in place. For full details of the diversion routes, please visit <https://nationalhighways.co.uk/our-roads/west-midlands>.

I'd like to apologise in advance for any inconvenience or disruption to those living close to the work. We'll make every effort to carefully manage noise levels and additional lighting to minimise the impact.
