Getting Medical help

Advice from The Staffordshire and Stoke-on-Trent Integrated Care Board

If you need urgent medical help this winter, whether that be for symptoms you're worried about, if you or a loved one has fallen or injured themselves, if you child has injured themselves or is unwell, or if you've got a dental problem, you can get immediate help by heading over to www.111.nhs.uk. You will answer a few questions about the health need, and get instant support and advice about how you could self-care, or where you need to go to get further support. If you don't have access to the internet, or if your little one is aged five or under, call '111' for the same help and advice

If you are told you need to go to an Emergency Department (A&E) and it is not life-threatening, you may not need an ambulance. Think whether a family member or friend can take you, or help you get there.

If you're trying to get an appointment at your local GP surgery, remember, it might be better to see another member of the qualified team members within your practice – seeing your GP isn't necessarily always the best option, and might mean you waiting longer. If your practice does not have any appointments available, ask about Enhanced Access appointments. You may be able to visit another practice within a few miles of your own surgery, much sooner.

In life-threatening emergencies, you should always dial 999 immediately.

Community Speed Watch

Community Speedwatch (CSW) is a national initiative where, in partnership with the police, members of communities use detection devices to monitor local vehicle speeds.

The volunteers report drivers exceeding the speed limit to the police with the aim of educating drivers to slow down.

If the data proves a driver is ignoring repeated warnings police can prosecute them. The aim is to:

- reduce death and injury on the roads
- improve the quality of life for local communities
- reduce the speed of vehicles to the speed limit
- increase public awareness of inappropriate speed

The group has successfully identified areas of the parish that need closer monitoring and speed indicator devices have been installed. To keep this much valued community group going we need volunteers. Training is provided by Staffordshire police and on average you would need to commit just one hour per month of your time.

DOG FOULING

Please see the letter from the Envirocrime office at South Staffordshire Council regarding dog fouling:

I have received complaints that dog fouling on the pavements is a regular problem in your local area. Unfortunately, despite the vast majority of dog owners behaving in a responsible manner, the behaviour of the minority has an adverse effect on the quality of life for many of their neighbours.

Aside from the unpleasant experience of having to clean shoes, wheelchair and pushchair wheels and carpets, it also presents a real risk to health. Toxocariasis is caused by a parasite which lives in a dog's digestive system. In humans, this can cause seizures, stomach upsets, breathing difficulties and can even cause blindness. If you are a dog owner, please ensure that you take an adequate supply of dog poop bags with you when you go for a walk. On occasions where there is an unexpected problem, please do ask a fellow dog walker for help or return to clean up as soon as you can. Please also ensure that you pay attention to what your dog is doing, particularly when off the lead or on a long lead.

If you witness someone allowing a dog to foul, do get in touch with us so that we can take action against them. The council needs your help in order to deal with this minority of dog owners who have such a negative impact on other people's lives. Together, we can keep the pavements clean and safe for everyone.

LSWA PC provide free dog bags at the dog walk off Marston Field so if you are short please use bags from this location

What is a Parish Council?

Lapley, Stretton and Wheaton Aston Parish Council is the first tier of Local Government and is closest to the community it serves. It can take decisions and spend money on matters that make a real difference to our parish. The other two tiers of local council are South Staffordshire Council and Staffordshire County Council.

What does LSWA Parish Council do?

It represents three wards- Lapley, Stretton and Wheaton Aston.

The PC tries to improve the quality of life in the parish and provides services to meet local needs such as annual Christmas illuminations and switch on event, planters and tubs around the village, parks, playing fields and, coming soon, allotments.

What are Parish Councillors?

They are democratically elected councillors who work hard to represent and engage with their local community. LSWA Parish Council is made up of 11 unpaid councillors who hold office for a 4 year term. To become a Parish Councillor you must be eligible, not disqualified and follow the 7 principles of public life, and be able to attend council meetings on Thursday evenings and working groups when required.

Bleed kits

LSWA PC will be installing 3 bleed kits into the defib houses at Marston Rd, Stretton and Lapley. The kits can significantly increase the chances of survival if used correctly on traumatic bleeding. LSWA PC encourages other organisations, especially those working with machinery, to consider purchasing a bleed kit for their work environment.
