On the 18th January the clerk, Amy, had the pleasure of accompanying Ted and his family to witness Ted receive A British Citizen Award for services to the community.

This is what they had to say about him:

For 40 years Thomas, known as Ted, has volunteered in his local parish and is the longest servicing councillor in its history. In addition, he coached local children's cricket for many years, volunteers on the sports club committee and helps with the luncheon club, aimed at older residents who are lonely and vulnerable. Ted helped install play areas in the parish, aided in the Platinum Jubilee allotment project, and supports the churches in the parish and clubs that they run.

The length of time Ted has volunteered and the variety of clubs he has committed his time to, has had a massively positive impact on the local community. Ted's commitment to his community is second to none. During the pandemic Ted turned 80 years old and was classed as vulnerable, yet he still organized and delivered Christmas hampers to even more vulnerable residents at Christmas with a mantra that 'their needs were of more concern than his own health'.

Ted is chair of the village hall committee and always looking at ways to bring the community together for events. He is working closely with the parish to reduce its carbon footprint and promotes a healthy lifestyle by making the local outdoor spaces attractive and accessible for all.

Ted was presented with the BCA Medal of Honor by Tom Redman, Managing Director from BCA supporters Big Bus London.

Problems with parking around the Cobbles and High street

We have been made aware that cars parked at the Cobbles and High street, mostly during the day times, are causing an issue for individuals trying to pass by on mobility aids or for those with pushchairs. Please be mindful where you park, the pavements are narrow and for pedestrians in the first instance . Delivery drivers are also having issues delivering medications to the Doctor Surgery as they cannot gain access. Parking on the double yellows is illegal (unless there is an exemption) and also affect the visibility for vehicles, this is a road safety issue . Please report issues to the relevant authority

The parish council have been doing a lot of work behind the scenes to begin the process of a overhaul for Marston Field. Thank you to all of those that took part in our initial survey. It is clear form the comments that the parish would like to see this area better used, would like to feel safer to be there and would like more activities for all ages. The bike pump track has come out hugely popular and is a definite on the PC's want list. Gym equipment and improvement of the play equipment are the next sources of our surveys. We hope to find the right mixture for all ages for the gym equipment whilst also utilizing the track. The play equipment is aimed at 8 years plus with Primrose play area aimed at the under 8 years age range. Allotment update

We are really pleased to say we are at the final hurdle for the allotment project! Once the final funding source has been secured work can begin, we anticipate work to begin in April. If you have applied for a plot, you are still on the waiting list and we will be in touch as the project progresses

Funding opportunities

Funding of £351,000 is up for grabs to help improve the health and wellbeing of communities in South Staffordshire.

The financial boost, facilitated by South Staffordshire Council and partners, is available through four different pots, each of which have different eligibility criteria.

The first funding stream is the £236,000 Health Inequalities Fund from Staffordshire County Council to tackle health inequalities in the district.

Examples of projects which could be eligible include initiatives to enhance public spaces; reduce social isolation; improve energy efficiency; provide cost of living support; improve community cohesion; prevent falls; offer play provision; reduce damp and mould; and promote healthy eating.

This funding must be allocated by September 2024.

Next is the South Staffordshire Community Wellbeing Fund, which offers a total of £20,000.

This funding is to support community and wellbeing projects which meet local priorities. The maximum funding available for each project under this stream is £1,000.

The West Midlands Interchange (WMI) Project Community Fund is a £65,000 pot granted to the district council by the site's developers as mitigation for the project.

This will be available for community projects within a three-mile radius of the site.

The types of projects which may qualify include schemes to enhance public spaces and facilities and initiatives to maximise public use of the community parks to be provided at WMI.

The Community is the Best Medicine fund offers a £30,000 pot to support community groups and initiatives.

This funding is for projects which support the most vulnerable in the district.

Update from The Watershed Benefice

We said a sad farewell to Rev Rachel in February, with a service at Blymhill followed by afternoon tea, which was attended by over 90 people, gathered to wish Rachel and Crispin good luck in their new parish in North Wales, and to present them with gifts to thank them for their ministry and friendship over the last twelve years. We are now working with the Diocese to begin the process of finding a new rector, but in the meantime we wish to assure everyone that church is still open! All of our services and events as well as weddings, baptisms and funerals will continue as normal with the services of Retired Minister Rev.
